City Completes Initial Review of Mel's Pressure Washing Issue

GREENSBORO, NC (May 2, 2014) – The City of Greensboro has determined that there were violations of its policies after reviewing an issue involving a company hired to perform pressure washing and vehicle lubrication services. The business, Mel's Pressure Washing, is owned by the wife of City employee Melvin Dick.

Once the City learned of the allegations involving a potential conflict of interest with a City employee, City Manager Jim Westmoreland charged an internal team with reviewing the issues to identify any potential missteps taken by the City or the vendor. "We are concerned anytime we identify policy violations and we are working to correct those issues immediately," says Westmoreland. "Over the last several weeks our team has taken the necessary time to conduct a comprehensive and thorough review of our internal policies and practices to identify any violations. Based on the initial findings I received today, I am very concerned about some of our financial polices and have implemented a series of follow-up actions to insure we obtain a complete picture on these issues and ways to improve."

The initial review identified specific personnel policy violations in the equipment services division regarding the City's secondary employment and gift policies. The City's secondary employment policy requires that employees disclose their outside employment with their supervisors and do not work during time they are employed by the City. The gift and conflict of interest policies discourage employees from taking financial contributions for personal interests and gain.

The review also identified policy violations with the vendor being paid primarily through the use of City procurement cards and without a qualified City service contact. The payments often exceeded the daily limit of the cards and included the use of two cards to make the payments, which violates the procurement card policy. In addition, two City procurement cards were provided to the vendor to charge for services rendered without any direct City oversight.

"With this news, it's vitally important to me that we immediately gain a better understanding of how our polices failed and our work processes allowed these issues to occur and to identify improvements to ensure we do have not these kinds of issues in the future," says Westmoreland. Westmoreland says the City is working to further understand the full scope of violations and today is taking the following actions:

- Suspending the use of procurement cards within the equipment services division;
- Implementing personnel changes and actions within the division (Due to the constraints
 of North Carolina personnel law, the personnel actions are not being disclosed at this
 time.);
- Continuing to identify and discontinue instances where the City's procurement card and service contract polices and processes have been violated;
- Immediately retaining the assistance of an outside forensic audit consultant to assist with the further review of the procurement card policy violations, examine the organizationwide use of procurement cards, and provide recommendations on system improvements;
- Identifying and correcting policy deficiencies and enhancing internal controls within the financial and equipment services functions;
- Reinforcing to the City's department directors and employees the importance of adhering to the City's procurement card policy, sound financial and business practices, and core values.

Between 2005 and 2014, the City paid Mel's Pressure Washing approximately \$577,000 (over nine year period, includes all services for both equipment services division and engineering and inspections department), including checks and card payments, to clean the City truck wash bays, clean and detail City-owned vehicles and buildings, and to provide hydraulic equipment lubrication services. The vendor relationship pre-dates Melvin Dick's employment with the City, which started in 2007.

In mid-April, the City suspended the use of Mel's Pressure Washing and issued a request for bids from area businesses for both the pressure washing/cleaning and the lubrication services. A new business has been retained to provide lubrication services and the City is finalizing its decision regarding the washing services. The City has ceased all operations with Mel's Pressure Washing.

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The City works with the community to improve the quality of life for residents through inclusion, diversity, and trust. As the seventh largest employer in Greensboro, the City has a professional staff of 2,800 employees who maintain the values of honesty, integrity, stewardship, and respect. SUBJECT: Tree Workshops

Two tree workshops have been scheduled for the College Hill and Charles B. Aycock Historic Districts. Foresters from W. H. Lock and Associates will present the results of the tree inventories they conducted in these two historic neighborhoods over the past year.

College Hill

Using handheld GPS units, the foresters collected data including species, size, and condition for all trees 4" in diameter and larger. This information was downloaded into the City's Geographic Information System so that it can be mapped. Interactive versions of the maps will be made available online this summer.

At the workshops, the foresters will discuss how the inventory can be updated as trees are removed and new trees planted and how the information can be used to guide reforestation efforts in the neighborhoods. The inventory will also help to identify suitable locations for new trees that will not conflict with overhead power lines. The foresters will also offer advice about caring for trees and proper tree pruning techniques.

We received a total of 10 comments this week:

Executive – 2 comments:

- Customer says he just received his At Your Service for April and May on April 22, where it reminds about the holiday collection schedule for Good Friday and Memorial Day. He feel like it should have been included in the last insert, so that he was not notified about the Good Friday collection schedule after the date has passed.
- I just wanted to take a moment to let someone know about my excellent experience with the city's employees yesterday when they came to make a repair in my front yard. I actually had a great experience with two crews. one who came on Monday, April 21 to investigate the problem and the other crew who came on Tuesday, April 22 to repair it. Both crews were very kind and extremely helpful in a situation that was very stressful for us as homeowners. The city's employees went out of their way to make sure we were taken care of and the problem was fixed quickly. The work was performed and cleaned up thoroughly and quickly. I have never met a nicer, more well-mannered group of individuals in this industry. These city employees certainly made my day and I am very grateful for their friendliness, kindness, and the excellent work they performed.

Field Operations – 7 comments:

- On April 18, caller's tire was blown by a pothole and her car was damaged again today by another big pothole on Holts Chapel Rd. Customer is upset by the state of the roads in Greensboro. Within the same week, she damaged her car twice. She thinks we need to do a better job of maintaining them.
- Entire street was missed Thursday for garbage collection (holiday week). Caller is not happy with service level.
- Caller wanted to say thanks for coming back and getting his recycling can along with his neighbors.
- Blackmoor Rd. was missed for recycle cans. Caller is not happy with the service level.
- Thank you to the crew for storm debris. Really appreciates this. Crew was very professional in their job. Wanted to let the crews know.
- Caller is upset that they are always the last to be picked up when there is a state of emergency. Caller states they are the last for storm debris pickup, the last to receive power in outages, and the last to get snow removal. They do not understand why they are always put at the bottom of the list. Caller would like the city to know this is ridiculous and they are very upset with how things are being run in the city.
- I've called daily since the storm. This is a disgrace that no one has come to pick up the storm debris.

Water Resources – 1 comment:

• Customer thinks it's not really fair to charge tenants a deposit and make them come into the office. It doesn't really make sense.

Overall

Calls about storm debris collection and calls related to the holiday garbage collection schedule for the Good Friday holiday caused a significant impact to our call volume last week. Call volume was very busy through the end of the week.
