

BetterBuildings Energy-Efficiency Grants Available to Homeowners

Greensboro residents now have the opportunity to make their homes more energy-efficient by taking advantage of the BetterBuildings grant program. The federally funded program offers grant assistance and a rebate and incentive package to homeowners who make qualified upgrades that result in at least a 15 percent improvement in their home's energy usage. Qualified homeowners will receive up to \$2,000 worth of energy upgrades. Higher income households will receive an energy assessment rebate and other incentives.

The grant provides for basic upgrades, such as insulation improvements and heating and air duct sealing. Homeowners can seek low-interest loans through banks and lenders that have partnered with the program to pay for work performed beyond what is covered in the grant. Everyone who participates in the BetterBuildings program will receive a complimentary introduction package that includes CFL light bulbs, a programmable thermostat, and low-flow shower heads. Domestic Violence Awareness Month

Domestic violence and emotional abuse are behaviors used by one person in a relationship to control the other. Abuse is not always physical or of a sexual nature, but can be emotional, economic or psychological. This includes behaviors that frighten, intimidate, terrorize, manipulate, hurt, humiliate, blame, injure or wound someone. Here are some ways to get help and stay safe:

- If you are experiencing abuse, talk to someone you trust and consider getting help to end your relationship safely.
- If you are abusing someone, take responsibility for ending the abuse by getting help for yourself.
- If you know someone who is experiencing abuse, tell him or her you are concerned and encourage the person to get help.

US Figure Skating Championships Nominated for Two Awards

The 2011 AT&T US Figure Skating Champsionships held here in January are nominated for two awards in the categories of "Best Multi-Sport or Multi-Discipline Event" and "Sport Event of the Year" by readers of SportsTravel magazine.

The event held at the Greensboro Coliseum Complex, featured competition, practice, and FanFest in one venue. The competitive events drew 110,787 fans with an additional attendance of 50,805 at the FanFest, practice rink, and related activities. It was the first time the US Figure Skating Championships were hosted in the Carolinas.

Winners of the magazine's awards will be announced at the TEAMS '11 Conference and Expo in October.
