#### Glenwood Center Hosts Basketball Camp and Soccer Clinics

Council approves the sale of Bessemer Shopping Center

During its meeting on November 1, City Council approved the sale of Bessemer Shopping Center to New Bessemer Associates with a 40-year, no-interest loan for \$685,000 to cover renovations and the cost of the property. The loan will go into effect when 75 percent of the plaza space has been filled. New Bessemer Associates is also seeking a \$1 million private loan to revitalize the plaza. The company is targeting a national grocery store chain for the plaza, which has been without a grocery store since 1998.

City crime prevention program recognized for educating the public
