Council approves \$80,000 grant to assist business owners

During its meeting on October 18, City Council approved a grant program to support entrepreneurs and small business owners in Greensboro. In partnership with the Community Foundation and the Greensboro Chamber of Commerce, the Greensboro Community Development Fund is an \$80,000 loan pool open to businesses in low-income areas and minority or women business owners. The fund was established to assist business owners who cannot acquire funding through traditional lending institutions. # Pottery Demonstration and Trunk Show at Greensboro Historical Museum

#### Local potter demonstrates North Carolina craft

Visit the Greensboro Historical Museum for a pottery demonstration and trunk show on Saturday, November 5, from 12 noon to 3 pm. Admission is free.

Travis Owens of Jugtown Pottery in Seagrove will demonstrate and explain the craftsmanship and technique that has been passed down through generations of Seagrove area potters. He will use North Carolina clay and a potter's wheel modeled after those used centuries ago.

The trunk show features limited edition and signed pieces. Other pieces from Jugtown Pottery are also shown in the Joanne and
