Loose Leaf Program Now Underway

The City's annual Loose Leaf Collection Program is now in effect until January 26, 2013. Learn more at www.greensboro-nc.gov/Leaves.

Leaves that are curbside by:

- November 13 will be picked up by December 21.
- December 26 will be picked up by January 26, 2013.



It's easy to use the Leaf Collection Program. Follow these tips:

- Rake leaves to the edge of your yard behind the curb, not in the street.
- Remove sticks, rocks, and other debris that may damage City equipment.
- Do not park vehicles on, in front of, or near leaves.

Pay City Water Bills by Phone

You can now pay your City water bills and access your account information over the phone by



calling 373-IPAY (4729). The system, called City Pay, is one of several ways you can pay water bills.

By calling 373-IPAY (4729), you can pay the full balance on your bill using a valid debit or credit card and get a confirmation of the payment.

The City has begun a one-year pilot program with Mattress GO Round to collect used mattresses and box springs.
