Public Record Requests Available Online

Greensboro residents are now able to submit public information requests (PIRTS) and view open and closed record requests on the City's website at www.greensboronc.gov/PIRT. By opening the City's records' tracking system to the public, residents can view the status of open requests, track completed requests, and obtain records and details from closed requests.

City Increases Fees/Fines

As of July 1, the City increased various fees and fines. They include:

- A \$50 fine will now be assessed for the second false alarm at the same property within a 12-month timeframe and there will be a \$100 fine for the third through fourth false alarms fine, \$250 for the fifth through ninth fine, and \$500 for 10 or more fines.
- Minimum building, electrical, mechanical and plumbing permit fees increase to \$75.
- A driveway permit fee increases to \$75.
- Commercial refuse fees increase \$3 per month, per dumpster, and \$10 per month, per vertical compactor.
- The fee for after-school programs hosted by City community recreation centers increases \$5 per week to \$30.

Greensboro Joins Watch for Me NC Campaign

The City, along with University of North Carolina-Greensboro,





and NC A&T State University, has been selected as a partner in the Watch for Me NC program, an NC Department of Transportation campaign to improve enforcement of bicycle and pedestrian safety laws and educate motorists, pedestrians and cyclists on safety awareness. Police Chief Miller to Retire

Greensboro Police Chief Ken Miller will retire between September 1 and December 31 from the City. He joined the police department in 2010 after serving as deputy chief for Charlotte-Mecklenburg Police Department for four years.

The City will hire a consultant to guide the selection process for a new chief. Depending on the timing of Miller's departure, the City may name an acting chief to serve in the transition between Miller and the newly hired chief.

Run 4 the Greenway is September 6


