City Increases Water Deposit Fee

Beginning July 1, it will cost residential and commercial renters a little more to get their water turned on. Water deposits for residential rental properties will increase to \$150, while deposits for commercial rental properties will increase to a minimum of \$200. The \$15 service fee for setting up new accounts will not change. This resolution was passed by Greensboro City Council in October 2009.

Also, as part of the resolution, starting July 1, tenants will be solely responsible for unpaid water bills when the account is held in their name.

Current deposits on accounts paid prior to July 1 will not increase. For more information, call 336-373-CITY (2489).

Greensboro's 'cold cases'

The Greensboro Police Department continues to try to solve old cases, called "cold cases." Each month on its Web page -- greensboro-nc.gov/departments/Police/coldcases -- previously unsolved cases like the one below are randomly highlighted. The police ask for information and assistance in apprehending those responsible for these crimes.
