10-Digit Phone Number Needed to Call the City

Effective April 23, placing a phone call in the Piedmont -- and to any City of Greensboro office or facility -- requires the full 10 digits (area code + seven-digit local number).

You will still be able to dial just three digits to reach 9-1-1 in case of emergencies.

The dialing pattern change is in response to a new 743 area code being added to the Piedmont area. Then, beginning May 23, phone customers in the 336 area code region requesting new service, adding an additional line, or in some



cases moving their service, may be assigned new numbers in either the 336 or 743 area code.

Nugent is City's New Fire Chief

Bobby Nugent, a 37-year veteran of the Greensboro Fire Department, has been appointed the City's newest fire chief. He has served as interim fire chief since July 2015.

Prior to that, Nugent was deputy fire chief for six years, managing the department's emergency service delivery system -- a role in which he oversaw 25 stations and 500 members of the department. During his tenure with the Fire Department, he has served as captain, battalion chief and assistant chief.



Do You Live in a Flood Zone?

Floods can occur with little advance warning. Learn ways to protect yourself and your personal property.

- Elevate electrical panels, air conditioners, heat pumps, furnaces, fuel tanks and water heaters at least 12 inches above projected flood heights.
- Report blockages in storm drains, culverts and under bridges to the City Contact Center at 336-373-CITY (2489).
- Consider purchasing flood insurance. Flood damage is not usually covered by a standard homeowner policy.

Attend a City Council Meeting

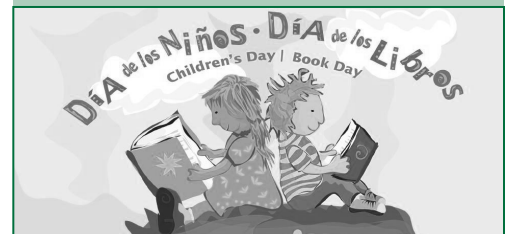

Changes Coming to Front Yard Parking Enforcement

Parking on "grass or bare earth areas" is prohibited in the front yards of single-family and duplex residential properties in Greensboro and as of July 1, vehicles in violation of this City Land Development Ordinance will receive a warning followed by a \$50 parking ticket. Failure to pay for three parking tickets within a 90-day period may result in wheel locks being attached to the vehicle.

Annual Sewage and Water Report Available for Review

The City's 2015 Sewage Collection and Water Reclamation report is now available at the following locations: Vance H. Chavis Branch Library, McGirt-Horton Branch Library, Central Library, Melvin Municipal Office Building, Water Resources Wastewater Facilities, and at www.greensboro-nc.gov/water.

The report provides details on how the wastewater system operates, how well it performed during the calendar year of January to December 2015, what violations occurred, and other relevant information.
