
Sign Ups Now Open for Library's **Summer Reading Program**

Water Disinfection Treatment Changes Temporarily for Testing

In a continuing effort to improve water quality, local water utilities including Greensboro's are conducting a routine water quality preventative maintenance program June 27 through July 25.

This involves temporarily switching water disinfectants from the present chloramines to chlorine to optimize water quality within distribution systems. The temporary process change is strongly recommended by state and federal regulatory agencies to preserve water quality by

ensuring persistent disinfection levels exist throughout the system.

During the switch, you may notice temporary color, taste, and odor differences. This is a normal part of the process; water quality is not affected. Learn more at www. greensboro-nc.gov/Preventative Maintenance.
