Adopted FY 2016-17 City Budget Now Online

The City's adopted budget for FY 2016-17 is now posted online at www.greensboro-nc.gov/AdoptedBudget. City Council approved the \$488 million budget at its June 14 meeting. The budget resolves a \$3.5 million gap in the general fund without raising the tax rate.

City Increases Fees/Fines

For the tenth consecutive year, the City is not raising the tax rate, but effective July 1, the City increased its water/sewer rates and vehicle license fees.

Rate changes include:

- Water and sewer rate increase of 4.5 percent for both Greensboro residents and those who live outside of Greensboro.
- Vehicle license fees increased from \$10 to \$30. The last increase in this fee was in 1991.

Downtown Preps for This Year's National Folk Festival



The 75th National Folk Festival is scheduled for September 9-11 in downtown Greensboro with 30-plus groups of performers on seven stages, the NC Folklife Area, Family

Activities Area, NC Arts Marketplace and Festival Food Courts.

The free event celebrates America's diverse culture with music, dance, foods and crafts.

As it did last year, the City is offering several ways to get to and from the festival safely, easily and economically.

If traveling by car, three downtown parking decks will be open for a flat rate of \$10 per day on a first-come, first-serve basis. Or, park for free at designated Park 'n Ride lots and take a Greensboro Transit Authority (GTA) bus to and from the heart of the festival.

You may also take a GTA bus along any of the system's daily routes and seven



Sunday routes from any GTA bus stop to downtown free of charge during the three-day event.

Want to bicycle to the festival? No problem. Ride along one of the City's signed bicycle routes that go through downtown or participate in group rides to the festival.

City Launches "Operation Bed Roll" Project

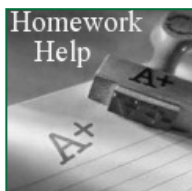
The City's Field Operations and Police departments are partnering for Operation Bed Roll, a project that aims to transform thousands of plastic grocery bags into "plarn," or plastic bag yarn, to create crocheted sleeping mats that provide an insulated barrier for those who sleep on the ground. The goal is to create 100 sleeping mats for homeless residents by October.
