Pay-by-App Option Available for **Metered Parking** 

Downtown drivers can now pay to park at all meters and three Cityowned surface parking lots using the online mobile payment system Parkmobile.

Parkmobile by downloading the mobile app for iPhone, Android, or Windows phones and following the instructions to set up payment by credit card, PayPal, or Masterpass. Locate the green Parkmobile sign on the meter or near the pay station to identify your parking location and choose how long you want to park.

#### **Fire Department Receives Agency Accreditation**

The Greensboro Fire Department recently received Agency Accreditation status from the Center for Public Safety Excellence Accreditation (CPSE). This is the fifth consecutive occasion the department has received this recognition. Greensboro is one of only two fire departments in the nation to make that claim.

CPSE provides the only accreditation program for fire service organizations in the world, and offers nationally recognized designations for fire and emergency service officers.
