Participatory Budgeting Voting Now Underway

What does your neighborhood need? The City's Participatory Budgeting voting (PB) process might be able to help. Simply cast your vote for which projects you want to see funded in your community. You decide how to spend \$500,000 in public funds, \$100,000 in each City Council district.

For voting times, dates and locations, go to www.greensboro-nc.gov/ PBVoting. Voting runs from Monday, October 23 to Saturday, November 18.

Making a Trip to White Street Landfill?

If you need to bring yard waste to the White Street Landfill soon, take Cone Boulevard. A new extension to that roadway is now open for all landfill traffic. Need a Ride? Hop on a Bike



LimeBike is Greensboro's new bike share program. Bicycles can be rented by anyone for short trips for a small fee using the LimeBike mobile app, available for iPhone and Android smart phones. Prices start at \$1 for

30 minutes, and monthly rates are available.
