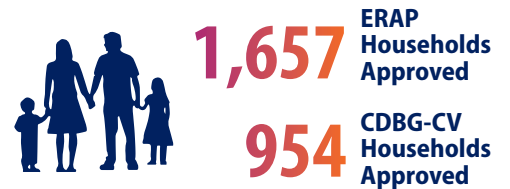

EMERGENCY ASSISTANCE

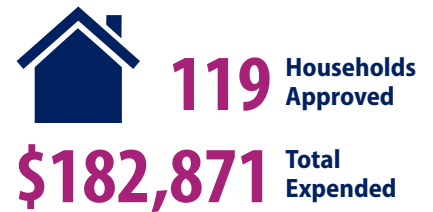

Based on CDC and HUD guidelines, the City shifted to providing hotel/motel assistance as a safer housing solution for **468 city residents** experiencing homelessness. Supportive Housing and Rapid Re-housing* solutions were put in place for residents experiencing homelessness during the COVID-19 pandemic.
