

## MTIP Amendment: Statewide Transit Projects

- Amends 3 existing statewide transit projects:
- Adjusts funding for two intercity bus projects
  - Amends FY 21 operations project TI-6109 to \$2.7M
  - Amends FY 21 administration project TM-0033 to \$2.7M
- FTA HOPE grant to plan for transit fleet electrification
  - Amends FY 21 funds to reflect \$12,000 state & \$110,000 FTA
- Amendment needed for STIP/MTIP consistency



## MTIP Amendment: MPO Area Roadway Projects

- Amends/ modifies 4 projects, starting with B-5717
- Replaces Gate City Blvd bridge over S. Buffalo Creek
- Adds to MTIP FY 2022 construction funding total \$8 million





## MTIP Modification: MPO Area Roadway Projects



- I-40 pavement rehab from Holden to Gate City Blvd
- Shifts construction from FY 23 to FY 22



## MTIP Modification: MPO Area Roadway Projects



- Widen NC 68/ NC 65 NC 65 to US 220/ Future I-73
- Shifts construction from 2023 to 2024
- Increases construction funding to \$28.4 million



## MTIP Modification: MPO Area Roadway Projects



- Friendly Ave and Lindell Rd intersection improvements
- Accelerates construction from FY 23 to FY 22

## MTIP Amendment: MPO Area Rail Projects



- P-5713 will grade separate Hilltop Rd at the NCRR
- Increases r/w funding to \$4.3 million & construction to \$10.5 million
- Schedule unchanged r/w 2023 & construction 2025


# 5310 Elderly & Disabled Transportation Project Selection & MTIP Adoption

- MPO directs 5310 Elderly & Disabled transit funds
- Coordinated Human Services Plan guides the process
- \$249,782 available for projects in FY 2021
- Call for projects to area transit agencies & nonprofits
- TAMs and GTA applied to continue 5310 funding for established services with a good track record
- No other applications were received
- Applications scored by a review team
- Both projects score well and are recommended for funding

### **Step Four:** Assignment of Local Input Points

- >Quantitative/ qualitative assessment
- > 1800 points (Regional and Division Tiers)
- >Up to 100 points per project
- Assigning points across all modes
- ▶Points can be donated
- Flex Policy option NEW



**Proposed addition to Step Four:** assignment of local input points

### Flex Policy Option

MPO has the option to apply the Local Input Point Flexing Policy. This means that up to 500 Local Input Points can be transferred between Regional and Division Categories. If the organization chooses to flex Local Input Points, MPO will provide written documentation to the SPOT Office prior to assigning Regional Impact Local Input Points.

- Continue regional freight model development in coordination with PART and NCDOT.

Conduct other model development and routine maintenance activities.

Network and Support systems relates to data collection, analysis, and the processes used to support transportation planning related to transportation infrastructure and transit operations. Work under Network and Support Systems will be conducted by MPO staff. This work will include purchase and use of data collection devices, data processing services, analytical software, and data packages as needed. Consultant services will be procured where noted or otherwise as needed.




