adoption of the following resolution, which up	oon being put to a vote was duly adopted.	

WHEREAS, the Greensboro MPO has been designated by the Governor of the State of North Carolina as the Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) responsible, together with the State, for the comprehensive, continuing, and cooperative transportation planning process for the MPO's metropolitan planning area; and;

WHEREAS the Highway Safety Improvement Program (HSIP) final rule (23 CFR Part 490) requires States to set targets for five safety performance measures annually, by August 31, and;

WHEREAS, the North Carolina Department of Transportation (NCDOT) has established targets for five performance measures based on five year rolling averages for: (1) Number of Fatalities, (2) Rate of Fatalities per 100 million Vehicle Miles Traveled (VMT), (3) Number of Serious Injuries, (4) Rate of Serious Injuries per 100 million VMT, and (5) Number of Non-Motorized (bicycle and pedestrian) Fatalities and Non-motorized Serious Injuries, and;

Plan revisions to incorporate value engineering ideas are complete

Changes include removal of enhancement area along Greensboro College's campus

& elimination of the extension of the A&Y Greenway from Hill St. to Benjamin Parkway.

Plan to put out to bid in February to have a construction start of May 2023

Greene Street Streetscape - Contract 2018-0480

Waterline installation is expected to begin in March 2023

The completion date for the contract is 450 days from NTP

Projects limits are from Washington St. to Bellemeade St.

Alamance Church Road Improvements - Contract 2011-0670

Construction is approximately 50% complete for the project

All water and sanitary sewer work is to be completed by March 2023

Widening is being installed in areas where utility installations are complete

Construction is expected to be completed by spring 2024

Ballinger Road Bridge Replacement - Contract 2016-037A

Bridge work is complete

Widening work and sidewalk installation currently underway

Waiting on dry weather and asphalt to install binder to open roadway



About the Plan

The Thoroughfare and Collector Street Plan is the official map identifying freeways, and major and minor thoroughfares and collector streets in the Greensboro Urban Area.

How It is Used

The plan is referenced in the Land Development Ordinance and used to:

- Establish street design standards including width, cross section, access, sidewalks, bicycle accommodations, transit shelter locations and more for specific roadway classifications.
- Obtain or protect public right-of-way when land is developed.
- Determine locations for proposed thoroughfares and collector streets planned to be built in the future.
- Control the number of future access points along thoroughfares.


