#### RESOLUTION OF SUPPORT FOR GTA'S GRANT APPLICATION FOR NCDOT'S MICROTRANSIT FEASIBILITY STUDY

A motion was made by TAC Member \_\_\_\_\_ and seconded by TAC Member \_\_\_\_\_ for the adoption of the following resolution, which upon being put to a vote was duly adopted.

WHEREAS, NCDOT'S Integrated Mobility Division (IMD) called for grant applications for a 100% NCDOT funded Microtransit Feasibility Study due on May 5, 2023; AND

WHEREAS, The Feasibility Study grant will fund planning and analysis for potential integration of microtransit service into existing transit operations; AND

WHEREAS, Microtransit is an emerging service option for transit agencies. The service involves an ondemand transportation solution, similar to Uber and Lyft services, that is flexible and responsive to the realtime demand of transit riders; AND

WHEREAS, the Greensboro Urban Area MPO and the Greensboro Transit Agency are in the beginning stages of an updated Long Range Transit Plan that will explore <a href="https://disable-level.concepts">https://disable-level.concepts</a> for alternative mobility solutions, and will need to study in depth the operational integration of On-Demand and <a href="https://disable-level.concepts">Microtransit</a>, solutions to implement any such service; AND

WHEREAS, GTA has many requests for service beyond the current fixed route network's service area and On-Demand/Microtransit solutions may enable GTA to reach these locations; AND

WHEREAS, to implement new service models IMD's staff capacity can help GTA with public and stakeholder engagement and surveys, funding mechanisms & capital needs analysis, evaluation of "turnkey" (Mobility as a Service) vs Software as a Service (SaaS), software and technology needs and procurement guidance, recommendations for service options (service zones, schedules, fixed-route replacement, driver and vehicle estimates, etc.); AND

NOW THEREFORE, be it resolved, that the Greensboro Urban Area Metropolitan Planning Organization hereby supports GTA's grant application for NCDOT <u>Nicrotransit</u> Feasibility Study.

WHEREAS, Article 2B of Chapter 136 of the North Carolina General Statutes and the Governor of North Carolina have designated the North Carolina Department of Transportation (NCDOT) as the agency responsible for administering federal and state public transportation funds; AND

WHEREAS, the North Carolina Department of Transportation will apply for a grant from the US Department of Transportation, Federal Transit Administration and receives funds from the North Carolina General Assembly to provide assistance for rural public transportation projects; AND

WHEREAS, the purpose of these transportation funds is to provide grant monies to local agencies for the provision of rural, small urban, and urban public transportation services consistent with the policy requirements of each funding source for planning, community and agency involvement, service design, service alternatives, training and conference participation, reporting and other requirements (drug and alcohol testing policy and program, disadvantaged business enterprise program, and fully allocated costs analysis); AND

WHEREAS, the funds applied for may be Administrative, Operating, Planning, or Capital funds and will have different percentages of federal, state, and local funds; AND

WHEREAS, non-Community Transportation applicants may apply for funding for "purchase-of-service" projects under the Capital Purchase of Service budget, Section 5310 program; AND

WHEREAS, City of Greensboro hereby assures and certifies that it will provide the required local matching funds; that its staff has the technical capacity to implement and manage the project(s), prepare required reports, obtain required training, attend meetings and conferences; and agrees to comply with the federal and state statutes, regulations, executive orders, Section 5333 (b) Warranty, and all administrative requirements related to the applications made to and grants received from the Federal Transit Administration, as well as the provisions of Section 1001 of Title 18, U. S. C.; AND

WHEREAS, the applicant has or will provide all annual certifications and assurances to the State of North Carolina required for the project; AND

NOW THEREFORE, be it resolved, be it resolved that the City Manager of the City of Greensboro is hereby authorized to submit grant application (s) for federal and state funding in response to NCDOT's calls for projects, make the necessary assurances and certifications and be empowered to enter into an agreement with the NCDOT to provide rural, small urban, and urban public transportation services.

## Approval of GTA Zero Emissions Fleet Transition Plan - April 2023 Edition

#### RESOLUTION APPROVING THE GREENSBORO TRANSIT AGENCY'S ZERO EMISSION FLEET TRANSITION PLAN

A motion was made by TAC Member \_\_\_\_\_ and seconded by TAC Member \_\_\_\_\_ for the adoption of the following resolution, which upon being put to a vote was duly adopted.

WHEREAS, the Greensboro Urban Area Metropolitan Planning Organization's (GUAMPO) Metropolitan Transportation 2045 Plan's vision is to develop and maintain a safe, efficient, and environmentally compatible transportation system that provides convenient choices for accessing destinations throughout the Greensboro Metropolitan Area and the Triad, including well-integrated, connected public transportation, pedestrian, and bicycle networks in a manner reflective of new trends in how people and goods move; AND

WHEREAS, whereas the Greensboro Transit Agency (GTA) established a goal to transition its fleet to 100% zero emission vehicles by 2040; AND

WHEREAS, GTA's fleet transition is underway with 17 battery electric buses and associated charging infrastructure, 24 diesel buses, 11 hybrid-electric, 47 gasoline paratransit vans; AND

WHEREAS, GUAMPO and GTA developed a baseline Zero Emission Fleet Transition (ZEFTP) completed in early April that estimates GTA's current fleet will be transitioned by 2035, and analyzes how to optimize the existing battery electric bus fleet's capacity with new charging infrastructure and scheduling techniques; AND

WHEREAS, GUAMPO and GTA will update the ZEFTP in the fall of 2023 in coordination with GTA's new Long-Range Transit Plan to analyze fleet and charger expansion needs in relation to new and improved routes; AND

WHEREAS, the City of Greensboro adopted a Strategic Energy Plan on December 20, 2020 committed to reducing greenhouse gas emissions from city government operations by at least 40 percent from estimated 2005 levels by 2025: AND

WHEREAS, The Strategic Energy Plan recommends the City's vehicle fleet, including GTA's, transition to zero emission vehicles by 2040; AND


WHEREAS, the Federal Transit Administration provides significant annual funding to GTA, and requires public transportation operators to provide a Zero Emission Fleet Transition Plan to maintain eligibility in federal discretionary funding programs through the Federal Transit Administration (FTA): AND

WHEREAS, GTA was awarded discretionary funding from the FTA for battery electric buses and charging infrastructure, which are pending procurement to await approval of GTA's baseline Zero Emission Fleet Transition Plan; AND

NOW THEREFORE, be it resolved, that the Greensboro Urban Area Metropolitan Planning Organization hereby approves GTA's baseline Zero Emission Fleet Transition Plan (dated April 2023) on this day May 10, 2023.

## **How is the plan used?**

- Implementation document for the land development ordinance of MPO member jurisdictions
- Establish appropriate street design standards including:

\*width \*cross section

\*access \*sidewalks

\*bicycle accommodations \*transit shelter locations


- Obtain or protect needed right-of-way in the land development process
- Exact location of collector and thoroughfares are determined during site development process

## How is the plan used? (cont.)

- Control the number of future access points along thoroughfares
- Ensure new construction is built at a suitable distance from freeways and thoroughfares
- > Allow for coordination of connectivity for new developments






