An operational permit is required to operate a special amusement building.

Definition: SPECIAL AMUSEMENT BUILDING. A building that is temporary, permanent or mobile that contains a device or system that conveys passengers or provides a walkway along, around or over a course in any direction as a form of amusement arranged so that the egress path is not readily apparent due to visual or audio distractions or an intentionally confounded egress path, or is not readily available because of the mode of conveyance through the building or structure.

This permit does not supersede any construction permit requirements.

Guilford County Schools

How do I submit for a Greensboro Fire Permit?

- 1. Go to www.greensboro-nc.gov/firepermits and download the applicable permit application(s) for your project.
- 2. On the applicable permit application, see the *Requirements for Fire Permitting and Inspection* section.
- 3. If a fire permit is required for your scope of work, combine the permit application and required documents into a single PDF and submit them at www.greensboro-nc.gov/PlanReviewandTracking (you will need to create a login). Once at your dashboard you will need to select "New Request." Enter the requested information and submit your plan.
- 4. We then receive the submittal and verify the fees are correct. You will then receive notification via email and your dashboard for payment. You can pay from your dashboard by clicking the "\$" beside your plan or by clicking the link in the email.
- 5. Once you pay online by credit/debit card, your submittal will go into the review queue. If the plan doesn't require payment we will confirm no fee is required and then add the plan to the queue.
- 6. Once your plan is reviewed, you will be able to resubmit a revision or download the approved set of plans directly from the website. Look in the comments section of your submittal for more information.
- 7. Once your permit has been approved, you will be able to download the approved and stamped set directly from the website. You may then call (336) 373-7829 to schedule a Fire inspection. An approved stamped set of paper plans shall be on site.

Requirements for Fire Permitting and Inspections

- **New Installations** ALL properties (that are subject to NC Fire Code)
 - All new Special Amusement Buildings = Permit submittal required see below for documents required (\$150) / Inspection Required (\$150)

Required documents:

- -Completed Permit Application
- -Detailed Life Safety Plan and floor layout
- -Occupant load calculations
- -Fire protection system plans
- -Component cut sheets and locations
- -List of all equipment being used in build and location shown on plan
- -Announcement Plan (NCFC 403.2.2)
- -Emergency egress or escape routes
- -Public Assembly areas
- -Vendor and food concession distribution
- -the need for the presence of Law Enforcement
- -the need for Fire and Emergency Medical Services personnel
- -List of names showing all trained crown managers (one crowd manager per 250 people)
- *Note- Tents will require an additional and separate permit application
- **Existing Installations** ALL properties (that are subject to NC Fire Code)
 - All existing Special Amusement Buildings = this permit application is only required for new installations. Once the building has had the final inspection, all future required inspections will be completed periodically as required for the occupancy classification and use in accordance with the NC Fire Code. Those inspections will re-verify fire code is being met in these buildings and you will be billed accordingly. For more information you may call the Deputy Fire Marshal over periodic fire inspections at 336-373-7844.
