



# **Action Items:**

- 2. MTIP Modification: Statewide Transit Projects: modify MTIP for three discretionary transit projects supporting facility construction in FY 2023.
- 3. MTIP Amendment: Safety Projects: amend MTIP to add six new safety projects focused on vulnerable road users (primarily pedestrians and bicycles) in FY 2023 and FY 2024.
- 4. MTIP Amendment & Modification: MPO Area Transit Projects: modify FY 2023 transit formula funding levels based on final full year appropriations. Optimize funding levels and details for specific projects based on consultation with MPO area transit operators.
- 5. FY 2023 Program of Projects: provides more information about FY 2023 transit projects with additional details not described in the Transportation Improvement Program. Projects and funding amounts are consistent with the preceding MTIP amendment & modification. 30 day public comment period was provided and a public hearing will be opened for the item if anyone signs up to share spoken comments at the meeting.
- 6. Performance Measures: adopts NCDOT targets for interstate and non-interstate National Highway System (NHS) pavement condition, NHS bridge condition, travel time reliability, freight reliability, and emissions reduction performance measures (PM2 and PM3).

Tyler Meyer called the meeting to order at approximately 2:00 PM.

# **Introductory Items**


#### 1. Orientation to Zoom Software

Tyler Meyer welcomed everyone to the March virtual meeting and reviewed how to use the Zoom software.

# 2. Opening Remarks and Roll Call

Craig McKinney took roll call for the public record. TCC members and others identified themselves.







#### **Action Items:**

# 1. March 13, 2023 Meeting Minutes

Tyler Meyer asked if any changes were needed to the minutes. No changes were recommended.

Mark Kirstner moved to approve the minutes. Kelly Larkins seconded. The TCC voted unanimously to approve.

# 2. MTIP Amendments and Modification: Statewide Projects:

Tram Truong was invited to take the group through action items. The first project is a statewide project and NCDOT has requested that the MPO make amendments and modifications to the 2029 MTIP by adding one statewide project and modifying nine statewide transit projects. The amendment will add project M-556 to create an advance right-of-way acquisition account. The project will place State Highway Trust funds into a revolving fund account to enable NCDOT to purchase right-of-way for projects where needed prior to initiation of the right-of-way phase. Such expenditures will later be paid back out of roadway project accounts once the right-of-way phase formally begins for those projects. The nine modified projects include TA-6665, TC-0020, TC-0021, TM-0027, TM-0028, TM-0031 and TU-0011. Truong stated that project TL-0032 for the city of Wilson will also be added to the MTIP. Recommendation is that the TAC will approve the MTIP modification and amendment for the 10 projects.

Meyer thanked Truong for presentation of the statewide projects and asked if there were any questions. Kirstner stated that he, as other members of the group probably did, wondered why the project in Wilson was included. Meyer state that the project was included to maintain MTIP-STIP consistency and said at some point the question could be posed as to why IMD has is processing local projects as statewide projects in this manner. There were no other questions from the group.

Mark Kirstner moved to approve. Steven Robinson seconded. The TAC voted unanimously to approve.

#### 3. MTIP Amendment and Modification: MPO Area Bridge Projects

Tram Truong introduced the second modification. NCDOT request the MPO to modify the MTIP to add segment A to the project I-5955 and amend MTIP to add segment G to project HS-2007. For the project I-5955A, they will rehabilitate 14 bridges on I-40 from South Buffalo Creek Bridge east of Freeman Mill Road to east of Gate City Boulevard and will be a sub-project of the project I-5955. This modification is to add the segment A to an assisting project I-5955 and add construction funding in FY 24, 25 and 26.

Project HS-2007G will construct a directional crossover at Lakeview Memorial Park Cemetery entrance on US 29. The directional crossover treatment will substantially improve traffic safety at this location by restricting left turns from US 29 south to Lakeview Cemetery. No left turns or straight or cross movements will be allowed from the cemetery entrance. This amendment is to add segment G to an existing safety project, HS-2007, and construction funding in FY 2003. Recommendation is that TAC will approve the MTIP modification and amendment for these two projects. There were no comments or questions from the group.

Hanna Cockburn moved to approve. Scott Whitaker seconded. The TAC voted unanimously to approve.

## 4. MTIP Amendment and Modifications: MPO Pedestrian & Bicycle Project (U-5532)

Truong introduced project U-5532, which provides the implementation of multiple MPO supported pedestrian and bicycle sub-projects. This amendment adds breaks to the TIP for each subproject and to change the funding sources to the Transportation Alternatives Program (TAP). Truong then described the funding amounts and scopes of the sub-projects referencing the table presented on the slide as follows:

Meyer opened the floor to questions and comments. Scott Whitaker observed that base maps may need to be updated since I-840 has been completed, and Meyer agreed and stated that all maps would be updated. He also stated that some of the presented projects are nearing construction phase and some are still in the acquisition phases.

Kelly Larkins moved to approve. Michael Abuya seconded. The TAC voted unanimously to approve.

#### 5. MTIP Modification: MPO CMAQ Transit Project

Tram Truong presented a CMAQ recommendation for FY 24 funding. Truong stated that the TAC approved a CMAQ funding award for project TL-0026 in FY 2024 at their March meeting, but GTA aims to start the new service early in FY 23 and the CMAQ funds are available for use in FY 23 per NCDOT. The MPO requests an administrative modification to shift the CMAQ funding from FY 24 to FY 23 so the GTA can start the project earlier. This administrative modification will shift federal CMAQ funds about \$1.450 million and local matching funds about \$362,000 from FY 24 to FY 23. There were no questions or comments from the group.

Mark Kirstner moved to approve the modification. Kelly Larkins seconded. The TCC voted unanimously to approve.

# 6. Fiscal Year 2023 Section 5310 Funding Award & MTIP Modifications

Tram Truong presented the recommended funding award and MTIP modifications. The MPO directs a small allocation of Section 5310 funds for elderly and disabled public transportation to area projects every year. The project selection process was established in the Coordinated Human Services Public Transportation Plan. For FY 2023, \$363,000 is available for projects. The MPO issued a call for projects from March 8 to April 7 to area transit agencies and eligible nonprofit groups. Two applications were received, from Guilford County TAMS and GTA. Guilford County TAMs requested a \$20,000 assistance grant and GTA requested \$343,000 to expand their early morning ADA paratransit service. Both projects were reviewed by Greensboro and Winston-Salem MPO staff and are recommended for funding at the amount requested. There were no comments or questions from the group.

Mark Kirstner move to approve the funding awards at the amount requested. Scott Whitaker seconded. The TCC voted unanimously to approve.

# 7. Resolution of Support for GTA Requests for NCDOT Grant matching & Micro Transit Study

Tyler Meyer introduced two resolutions of support. The first resolution will support a GTA request to obtain a 100% funding grant from Integrated Mobility Division to conduct a feasibility study for potential microtransit services in Greensboro. Meyer explained the basic concept of microtransit, which is a service to supplement fixed route transit using a "dial-a-ride" system to support transportation needs of people outside the service area for fixed route buses. This type of service is quite expensive, and is only appropriate for areas where fixed route transit cannot efficiently service due to low density land uses, peripheral locations, and budget constraints. The request is in response to many requests GTA has received to extend service to such areas. If GTA's application is successful, NCDOT would fund 100% of the requested microtransit study. The study would be coordinated with the Mobility Greensboro Long Range Transit Plan and other initiatives that GTA is undertaking.

The second resolution is to authorize the City of Greensboro to apply for, and enter into, funding agreements with the Integrated Mobility Division for state matching funds for a range of federally funded transit projects. Meyer noted that the TAC has authorized this periodically through the years. Meyer said that while the City clearly has the authority to apply for these grants as a longstanding FTA transit grantee, these resolutions are a formality required to satisfy NCDOT requirements. The recommendation is to enact these two resolutions. Alex Rotenberry elaborated that the micro transit feasibility study doesn't require a match by the transit agency and is 100% funded by the NCDOT. Kirstner questioned if the study would only include the areas inside of the city limits. Meyer clarified that though the study would serve the city of Greensboro as that is GTA's service area, city limits do change over time and developments on the edges might be taken into project areas. Kirstner stated that he was concerned with other communities such as Summerfield and Oakridge being left out of the study area since they are classic possibilities for micro transits. Meyer acknowledged that GTA's

submitted application already defines the study area in a certain way, but that if expanding the service area or providing transit in the town areas is a topic of interest to the towns and Guilford County, that it can be discussed by the group at a later time. Currently the Towns and unincorporated county are served by TAMS, though at a very low service level, and increasing TAMS service levels would be a more logical step then contracting microtransit companies. Rotenberry agreed with Meyer that expansion of micro or rural transit services could be a topic for future discussion once initial studies are done with the current proposed study area. No other comments or questions were given.

Mark Kirstner moved to approve recommendation to TAC. George Linney seconded. The TCC voted unanimously to approve.

## 8. Approval of the GTA Zero Emissions Fleet Transition Plan

Tyler Meyer introduced the Zero Emissions Fleet Transition Plan, which concerns GTA's current fleet and current operations and address all of the elements of a zero emissions fleet transition plan that are required under a new Infrastructure Investment and Job Act. Approval of this "baseline plan" would give GTA the ability to apply for charging infrastructure this spring as well as purchase four electric buses and associated charging infrastructure that it was awarded through a grant last year. There will be a subsequent addition in the fall that looks more comprehensively at longer term considerations, whereas the baseline plan is developed enough to look at the acquisition of battery electric vehicles. There were no comments or questions from the group.

Chris Spencer moved to recommend approval of the plan. Hannah Cockburn seconded. The TCC voted unanimously to approve.

#### 9. BiPed Plan Administrative Modification

Tyler Meyer introduced a recommended administrative modification to the BiPed Plan. The modification would provide for bicycle lanes on Tuscaloosa Street between Bennett Street and Willow Road and sharrows on either side of Tuscaloosa between Martin Luther King Jr. Drive and Bennett Street, as well as between Willow Road and English Street. These bicycle lanes and sharrows would provide a safer and better delineated route for cyclists on bicycle route 9, which traverses Tuscaloosa Street from US 29 to Willow Road. The amendment would update the map and the project lists. Meyer noted that the Bicycle and Pedestrian Advisory Committee was consulted and concurred with the recommendation.

Rotenberry questioned if the road had a low volume, and upon confirmation from Meyer stated that sharrows are useless and he would suggest budgeting for signage with sharrows. Meyer stated that there would be signage. Rotenberry stated that it is his opinion that sharrows are best used on low volume and low speed roads, including roads under 25 miles an hour. Whitaker asked for a definition of what a sharrow is, and Spencer stated that a sharrow is a marking put on pavement to indicate the cycle-specific area of a shared use lane, and is not a separate facility. Kirstner asked for confirmation that the date of the last Biped Plan was 2018 and if there was a timeframe for another update or amendment. Meyer stated that another amendment would be possible later this year, and it is being

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accessed whether that would be necessary, as the department wants to link together the Biped Plan, the Mobility Greensboro Plan, and the Safe Streets for All Plan. Meyer also mentioned that bicycle pedestrian counting is still on the priority list, with new technology assisting the count effort, and Kirstner recommended looking at the Household Travel Survey as well. There were no other questions or comments from the group.

Chris Spencer moved to recommend the modification. Mark Kirstner seconded. The TCC voted unanimously to approve.

## 10. Thoroughfare & Collector Plan Adoption

Lydia McIntyre introduced the recommended Thoroughfare & Collector Street Plan. The new plan, which will be used to support land development ordinance implementation, combines the previously separate Thoroughfare and Collector Street plans into a single, more user friendly and accessible format. The new plan is consistent with the 2045 Metropolitan Transportation Plan and reflects where previously planned roads have been constructed, where previously planned facilities are no longer possible due to development or environmental constraints, and where changes to the classification of facilities are recommended. The plan is not only used to protect needed right-of-way, but also encourages flexible negotiation between different planning stakeholders and connection between new developments.

The initial 6 month review cross-referenced long and short-range jurisdiction and MPO plans along with current development plans. An online GIS tool was developed in order to streamline and encourage public involvement and feedback. The tool was run from February 1 to April 3, 2023. Methods used to inform the public included newspaper advertisements, social media, an on-line meeting, and staff "office hours" for consultation and discussion on request. Additional steps taken included special notices to the development community, and two in person sessions offering developers and their representatives to meet with staff, review the new plan and provide comments. In total, there were 53 persons who responded to the survey. It was mentioned by Craig McKinney that the MPO also coordinated with host jurisdictions, and Spencer mentioned the inclusion of the Fire service, GPD, and Metro 911 as well. There were no more questions or comments.

Kelly Larkins moved to recommend Plan adoption. Hanna Cockburn seconded. The TCC voted unanimously to approve.

# Business Items / Potential Action Item(s):

## 1. Division Engineer Updates

Stephen Robinson started his update with acknowledging Chad Reimakoski in the meeting, who has recently accepted the division planning engineer position and will be taking over for Stephen for Division 7. Robinson began with page 76 of the agenda packets, stating that he did not have a lot to add. He did mention the pavement rehab on I-40 and BiPed project schedule revisions. Meyer also asked for updates on the letting schedule for the U-5841 Lindell Road at Friendly Avenue intersection project. Robinson stated that current date for that would be May 18, 2023.

## 2. Local Project Updates

Jason Geary provided the local projects updates.

- Final approval of the plans and specs was received from NCDOT for Downtown Greenway Phase 4. The project will be advertised on May 11 with an opening bid date of June 15.
- The Murrow Boulevard Bridge Project will be advertised on May 25 with the bid opening on June 22.
- Multiple general sidewalk contracts are coming up for bid soon, including projects U-5532E,
   David Street, and Alamance Church Road.
- Ballinger Road Bridge is now operational.
- The Eugene & Bellemeade, Summit Avenue, and Greene Street streetscapes are all at various stages in construction with most of the issues concerning utility placement.

Scott Whitaker noted that since the prior meeting, completion of the A&Y Greenway section from the pedestrian underpass on Highway 220 to north of the Community Park has been contracted out with Kimley-Horn, with an aggressive construction schedule planned. Alex Rosser then asked to give a few comments and shared his screen with the group. Marshall Aerospace announced that they have chosen PTI airport to build a large hangar for work on C-130 aircraft. The site is currently under construction and has an access road approved by DOT and plans for extension to the apartment complex on Pleasant Ridge Road. A site for future rental cars has also begun to be cleared off of Inman Road. Meyer invited Rosser to present the information at the TAC meeting, and then proceeded to Strategic Reports.

# 3. Strategic Reports

Tyler Meyer reported that the transit split for fiscal year of 2023 was made and TIP adjustments have been determined. All of the details will be provided in the Program of Projects document that will be reviewed until June 8, 2023. There were no questions concerning the transit split of Program of Projects. Meyer turned it over to Lydia McIntyre for her report.

McIntyre gave her report on Prioritization 7.0, which is the funding of projects in year 2026 through 2035. Two projects from the P 6.0 submittals were carried over and will be automatically considered for P 7.0, along with those projects which had been funded under the FY 2020-2029 STIP but were removed for STIP rebalancing purposes. McIntyre requested that all member jurisdictions submit their project application or submittal form back to the MPO by June 30 and resubmit any projects that were not funded under P 6.0. The evaluation of all projects will run from June to July, and the MPO will submit their projects to NCDOT on September 20. McIntyre then described the process of identifying carry over and holding projects from P 6.0 that could be resubmitted. Restrictions on aviation projects have been lifted and that information is included in packets sent to member jurisdictions. Meyer also reported that the MPO would be meeting within the month with the rail division about their project submittals and will maintain communication with Division 7 through the process. There were no further questions about the prioritization process.

The next item McIntyre gave an update on was the Safe Routes to School Grant. The grant focuses on education for grades K through 12 and is a 3-year grant funded program. The MPO currently has a consultant on board that is developing a curriculum and traffic garden toolkit to take to schools. A total of 3 million dollars were distributed to 12 different organizations, and we received just over \$343,000 and will be required to match 20% of the award.

The next item was an update on U-6108, the Battleground/ Lawndale/ Westover Terrace Corridor between Wendover and Fernwood project. U-6108 was previously funded under the FY 2020-2029 STIP but was removed for STIP rebalancing purposes and is therefore a carryover project for P7.0. It is funded for preliminary engineering only in the FY 2024-2033 TIP and will need to complete in P7.0 for implementation funding. Staff is coordinating with NCDOT to review and revise the project scope for P7.0 evaluation. Extensive public outreach was conducted with a community meeting, public review (running from March 13 until the end of April), interviews, and an electronic billboard at the south end of the corridor. At the public meeting on March 27, 2023, there were over 70 participants and almost 300 community members responded to the online survey that was distributed. A summary of those results will be given to the group at the next MPO meeting.

#### Other Items:

# 1. Member Agency Updates

Meyer then opened the floor to any updates from member agencies. Mark Kirstner spoke to give a few updates. His first update was regarding PART's recent Scenario Planning Workshop that was held with the FHWA a week before the TCC meeting. Participants gathered to discuss the growth allocation project that will impact growth allocation and scenario planning. Another workshop will be held late summer and early fall of this year. Secondly, PART was able to receive all of the surveys that were needed for the Household Travel Survey. The final report on the responses will be delivered sometime in June or July.

Alex Rotenberry then commented that there will be a webinar on May 25 at 10:00 AM held by the Integrated Mobility Division. The agenda consists of a speaker from the transportation planning division and discussion about discretionary grants, feasibility study grant programs, and microtransit feasibility studies. There were no other updates to be given by the group.

#### 2. Wrap- Up & Adjournment

Meyer established the next TCC meeting as June 20, 2023 at 2:00 PM.

Tyler Meyer adjourned the meeting at 3:27 PM.

NCDOT requests the MPO amend the 2020-2029 MTIP to modify three statewide transit projects.


# **Project Situation:**

Modifying these projects to the MTIP will maintain MTIP / STIP consistency, and would make Greensboro area transit agencies potentially eligible recipients. *Modifies funding in FY 2023 for projects TC-0005, TC-0008, and TC-0010*.

- TAC action to modify the FY 2020-2029 MTIP for three statewide transit projects TC-0005, TC-0008, and TC-0010.
- NCDOT STIP actions to modify three transit projects TC-0005, TC-0008, and TC-0010 at the July 6, 2023 Board of Transportation meeting.

WHEREAS, the Transportation Advisory Committee has reviewed the current 2020-2029 Metropolitan Transportation Improvement Program, adopted by the TAC on November 13, 2019 and has found that an amendment is needed; AND

WHEREAS, the NCDOT requested the MPO modify the 2020-2029 MTIP for three statewide transit projects TC-0005, TC-0008, and TC-0010; AND

WHEREAS, these amendment and modification are needed to maintain STIP – MTIP consistency as well as to make Greensboro area agencies potentially eligible recipients; AND

WHEREAS, the NC Board of Transportation is to modify the STIP for three statewide transit projects TC-0005, TC-0008, and TC-0010 on July 6, 2023; AND

WHEREAS, the Greensboro Urban Area conforms with the North Carolina State Implementation Plan for maintenance of the National Ambient Air Quality Standards; AND

WHEREAS, on April 21, 2021 the Federal Highway Administration and the Federal Transit Administration jointly certified that the MPO substantially meets the federal metropolitan transportation planning requirements, for a period of four years;

# FY 2020-2029 MTIP Amendment: Safety Projects

# Background:

NCDOT requests the MPO amend the 2020-2029 MTIP to add six new safety projects. These grouped projects will improve safety at multiple locations with a history of traffic crashes involving pedestrians, bicyclists, other vulnerable road users. The sub-projects for implementation will be selected using NCDOT's Highway Safety Improvement Program methodology. Intersections, midblock crossings, and greenway crossings may be frequent locations. The MPO will support that process by helping to identify candidate locations.

# **Project Situation:**

- HS-2015DIV, HS-2015REG, and HS-2015SW: these projects provide flexibility for implementing improvements anywhere across the state as needed. They are divided into three categories, Statewide, Regional, and Division to support improvements at all three STI tiers. Adds these projects and funding for Construction in FY 2023 and FY 2024.
- HS-2022DIV, HS-2022EG, and HS-2022SW: these projects provide flexibility for implementing improvements anywhere in Division 7 as needed. They are divided into three categories, Statewide, Regional, and Division to support improvements at all three STI tiers. Adds these projects and funding for Construction in FY 2023.
- This is the first time that NCDOT has created umbrella safety improvement projects focused specifically on vulnerable road users. Doing so is in response to the new *Vulnerable Road Users Rule* established under the *Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act* that mandates a specific percentage of federal highway safety funds be set aside to address crash issues involving vulnerable road users.




#### Recommended Action & Next Steps:

# FY 2020-2029 MTIP Amendment & Modification: MPO Area Transit Projects

## Background:

Transit funding levels are set each year through federal appropriations acts. Such legislation is typically not enacted until well into the fiscal year. Consequently, the MPO typically sets initial funding levels based on estimated appropriations, and then revises them once the full year appropriation is established. In FY 2023, the national funding level in core FTA formula programs (5307 and 5339) increased by 2% over FY 22 levels. For the Greensboro MPO, FTA formula funding levels increased by \$138,054 or 1.9%.

## **Project Situation:**

This amendment/modification makes end of year FY 2023 adjustments. These year-end changes are reflected in the FY 2023 Program of Projects, also on the June agenda. Adjustments include:

- Separates purchase of bus shelters to a new project TG-0019 with total funding \$192,000
- Increases TA-4767 replacement paratransit buses by \$16,000
- PART programs funds a year behind. PART's FY 2023 funding increase (\$130,006) will be programmed in FY 2024 later.
- FY 2023 PART changes include adjusting routine capital and operating assistance using prior year balances. PART will not use bus and bus facilities funding in FY 2023.
- Update future year funding levels (FY 2024-2029) based on the FY 2023 numbers.
- Section 5310 funding adjustments were approved in May meeting and are not included in this action.






GTA and PART bus services in Greensboro

# Background


The annual Program of Projects is a list of projects programmed for funding in a federal fiscal year from Federal Transit Formula Grants, any transit discretionary grants, any Federal Highway Funds flexed to FTA for transit improvements, and state formula grant programs. Such projects must also be identified in the MPO approved Metropolitan Transportation Improvement Program or the Unified Planning Work Program to be eligible for inclusion in the Program of Projects. The Program of Projects provides an additional opportunity for the public to learn about and comment on transit grants for the fiscal year.

The Program of Projects is developed and approved by the Metropolitan Planning Organization. The MPO is responsible for the MTIP and the UPWP, and is therefore responsible for the Program of Projects as well. The Program of Projects includes grants for GTA, PART, and Guilford County TAMs. The MPO follows its current Public Participation Plan, which requires a 30 day public comment period and a public hearing prior to the adoption of the Program of Projects. The comment period ran from May 9 to June 8, 2023, and the public hearing was held at the June 21, 2023 Transportation Advisory Committee meeting.

## FY 2023 Program of Projects

Federal fiscal year 2023 covers from October 1, 2022 to September 30, 2023. The FY 2023 Program of Projects includes programmed FTA formula grants under the following programs: Section 5303 Metropolitan Planning, Section 5305 Statewide Transportation Planning Program, Section 5307 Urbanized Formula, Section 5310 Enhanced Mobility of Seniors and Individuals with Disabilities, and Section 5339 Bus and Bus Facilities. The FY 2023 Program of Projects also includes other programmed grants: Flexed Federal Highway Funds used for transit purposes: the Congestion Mitigation and Air Quality Improvement Program (CMAQ) directed by the MPO or otherwise made available by NCDOT; discretionary Section 5339 funds made available by FTA. State Maintenance Assistance Program (SMAP) funds are also listed.

The Program of Projects also describes funds made available to subrecipients and grant details such as a description, federal funding amount, and matching funds amounts. The proposed program as identified in the Draft Program of Projects will be the final program unless amended or modified. Total FTA formula funding levels and well as funding distribution between projects are subject to change based on pending full year appropriations information from FTA.

## MPO Establishment of 2023 PM2 and PM3 Performance Measure Targets

### Background

Federal surface transportation law and regulations include requirements for performance-based planning and more specifically, performance-based transportation outcomes. Several divisions of the U.S. Department of Transportation (USDOT) are responsible for administering the national surface transportation, performance-based planning program with rule-making oversight by the FHWA and FTA.


Regulations, 23 CFR 490 and 23 CFR 450 further detailed the process that State DOT's and MPO's must follow regarding the inclusion of performance measures into the planning process, and implementation and details of the performance management process. The performance measures can broadly be grouped into three categories: PM1: Safety; PM2: Pavement/Bridge, and PM3: CMAQ, Reliability, and Freight.

Federal regulations require States to set targets for interstate and non-interstate National Highway System (NHS) pavement condition, NHS bridge condition, travel time reliability, freight reliability, and emissions reduction (PM2 and PM3). The NCDOT has officially established targets and transmitted them to FHWA December 2022.

FHWA guidance allows each MPO to establish PM2 and PM3 performance targets by either agreeing to plan and program projects so that they contribute toward the accomplishments of the State DOT 4-year targets or establish their own by 180 days after the State DOT(s) target is established.

The Greensboro MPO recommends to support meeting NCDOT established PM2 and PM3 performance targets.

**WHEREAS** Federal regulations require MPOs to establish targets within 180 days of the State establishing and reporting its targets to FHWA by agreeing to plan and program projects that contribute toward the accomplishment of the State's targets for each measure, or establish its own target.

## **Great Expectations!**

To better serve our riders, on July 31, 2023, PART is launching Service Expansions on two of our Express Routes! PART's **Route 9 Davidson County Greensboro Express** service will add four new run times. This route runs out of Greensboro's Galyon Depot. Stops include Market St. @ Greene St., UNCG @ Gate City Blvd., Coliseum Dr. @ Freemill Road, the High Point Depot, Guilford Technical Community College's (GTCC) High Point Campus, and the Thomasville Park & Ride lot. The added run times leave out of Greensboro's Galyon Depot at 7:30am, 9:30am, 11:30am, and 1:30pm.

In addition, we have enhancements to our existing Airport Connector service. We renamed the service **Route 25 Piedmont Triad International Airport Express**. We will ramp this service up from the existing on-demand service to running every 30 minutes from 6:15am-8:45pm Monday-Friday out of our Coble Transportation Center. Saturday service will remain on demand at this time! And ... the cost for this service is the same low fare as all other Express Services, \$2.50 one way with half price fare available for Seniors (60+), Disabled, Veterans, Students, and Medicare Cardholders. **PARTnc.org** 





## Transit Agencies, Universities, and Colleges Working Together!

The *Piedmont Triad University & College TDM Working Group* recently completed its third meeting as they continue to work together to establish a collective group of members. The group currently consists of eight Universities and Colleges spanning 6 Regional Transit Agencies and includes access to Amtrack, Greyhound, and the Piedmont Triad International Airport.

The group looked at what other North Carolina Institutions outside of the Triad Region are doing and compared what TDM (Transportation Demand Management) efforts are going on in our local communities.

As a result of these dialogues, the current Working Group has decided to collectively promote a series of Marketing Campaigns aimed at exposing students to our regional transportation network and the reduced or free fare payment systems available to all students across the different agencies. These campaigns will discuss the resources available, how to use these resources, and how to view our regional connections through **RideTheTriad.org.** Our goal is to create a program that encourages students to explore our vast region by utilizing alternative modes of transportation while discussing the positive environmental impacts of using these options.

















## It's Time To Reboot.

PART is rebooting our PARTnership Program. The PARTnership Program is an Employer-Based Mobility Options Program. It is a FREE resource for employers in the TRIAD.

#### **Benefits**

PARTnership Program members have access to several programs and services that PART can utilize to develop and implement customized transportation options to address their worksite's commuting challenges.

## **Expand Recruitment Area**

Companies interested in expanding their recruitment area to meet labor needs can remove barriers for prospective employees and alleviate concerns about the cost of driving to and from work by offering access to easy, affordable transportation options.

#### Improve Employee Benefits Package

Member companies will be able to receive professional guidance on implementing no-cost benefits such as preferential parking for carpools and vanpools, reduced bus fare or more complex benefits like the Federal Commuter Tax Benefit Program for employees.

## Address Parking Demands

Participating businesses can reduce the demand for parking at their worksite by helping employees access public transportation, encouraging them to share their ride to work, or offering a Vanpool Program. Every Vanpool can reduce 3-14 vehicles from a work site.

### Minimize Tardiness & Absenteeism

Dear Wright:

The MPO has reviewed the request for an emergency use crossover on I-840 between the interchanges at US 29 and SR 2770 (Huffine Mill Road).

As the request letter stated, I-840 is a four lane divided freeway with a posted speed limit of 65 MPH and a 2021 AADT of 21000 vehicles per day (5% truck). Access in this area is limited to a cloverleaf interchange at US 29 and a partially signalized full diamond interchange at SR 2770 (Huffine Mill Road). Typical median width is 46- feet which includes 4-foot paved median shoulders. Cable median barrier and rumble strips are present along the corridor. As you know, the US 29 interchange does not provide an expedient eastbound alternate route to respond to incidents on I-840 east of US 29.

The MPO agrees with you and Regional Traffic Engineer Brian Thomas that the proposed location at approximately STN 186+00 on the plans you provided would be an appropriate location for an emergency use crossover on this section of freeway. On behalf of the MPO, local emergency responders, and the community more generally for your quick action to identify this emergency crossover use for implementation in the near future.
