#### Morningside Awards

The City of Greensboro presents the Morningside Awards annually to five Dudley High School graduates in memory of the five lives lost in the Greensboro Massacre of 1979. The goal is to commemorate their lives and the legacy they left behind of standing for justice and equality.

Graduating Dudley seniors are encouraged to apply for one of the five \$1,979 Morningside Awards. Winners are determined by the applicant's commitment to advancing social justice and equality by:

- Future academic goals, including a post-secondary education path that addresses issues of discrimination, disparity, or inequity
- Future employment goals after high school graduation that will contribute to the lives of others in ways that work towards the elimination of inequities or disparities
- Future entrepreneurial goals, including any for- or non-profit organization, developed after graduation that improves the lives of marginalized populations
