

City to Buy Coliseum Inn and Former Canada Dry Facility

Purchase is intended to spur economic development along High Point Road.

In a bold effort to provide economic development and nuisance abatement along the High Point Road corridor, Greensboro City Manager Mitchell Johnson has announced an agreement to buy two properties near the Greensboro Coliseum Complex. One is the Coliseum Inn at 2438 High Point Road; the second is the former Canada Dry facility, located directly across Patterson Street from the Greensboro Coliseum Complex.

City Council authorized Johnson to move ahead with the purchase of both properties during a recent closed session. The City will pay \$2.1 million for the Coliseum Inn and \$3.2 million for the Canada Dry facility. Johnson said City Council encouraged "bold action" to spur economic development and added there are no specific plans for development of either of the properties.

Events range from sports and arts demonstrations to contests for all


