## **Proposed Budget Cuts**

Recommendations would help prevent a tax increase.

At City Council's request, City Manager Mitch Johnson has prepared a list of potential budget cuts and revenue increases for consideration in the 2007-08 budget in order to prevent a tax increase. At the March 27 Council briefing, Johnson shared the City's recommendations for reducing expenses.

The process started with City department heads, who came up with ways to reduce the budget by \$6 million. They then met with the City Managers at a three-day retreat in February where they prioritized the proposed cuts. The recommendations were presented to Council members for their review.
